7. HEALTH CORNER

TOPIC: ECZEMA

Definition: Eczema is a condition where areas of the skin become inflamed, itchy, red, cracked or scaly, and rough. Blisters can also occur.

Causes: The main cause is unknown but may be associated with;

- Poor personal hygiene.
- Exposure to specific substance and common among those with asthma and hay fever.

Mode of spread: Through skin to skin contact with blisters.

Signs: - Tiny blisters that weep/ooze which makes it communicable.

- Discoloured skin area.
- Itching.

Treatment: - Personal cleanliness should be improved through bathing at least twice a day and changing of clothing.

- The whole body should be washed vigorously with soap and water.
- Topical application should be applied on the areas examples include nixoderm cream, sulphur ointment.



Advice to Parents/Prevention

- If one person has eczema, everyone in the family should be treated.
- Clothing should be thoroughly washed and sundried.
- Body/face towels should not be shared among siblings.
- Do not share clothing and underwear.
